- **Blue Point Rastafa Rye Ale**

From Blue Point Brewery in Patchogue, New York, this 7.5% ABV brew uses a considerable amount of hops and rye grain to produce a unique and highly drinkable Rye Pale Ale. \$5.25 pints

- **Cap't Eli's Root Beer**

A craft-made root beer from Maine, made with natural ingredients and real sugar, not evil, processed corn syrup. 0% Alcohol & no caffeine; \$2.75 pints

- **Harpoon IPA**

A moderately-hoppy cross between an English IPA and American IPA. Brewed since 1993, that makes Harpoon IPA one of the longest-running craft brews in the country! 5.9% alcohol; \$5 pints

- **Hitachino Nest Classic Japanese Ale**

Forget what you know about Japanese Beer. Hitachino Nest is brewed by the premier craft brewer in Japan and balances malt, hops and cedar aging into a delicious and refreshing brew. Rare Beer!. 7% alcohol. \$6.5 goblets

- **Porterhouse Oyster Stout**

Most likely the first keg tapped in Florida, this oyster stout (using real oysters in the brewing process!) is from a tiny brewpub in Dublin, Ireland. It's smooth, flavorful, immensely drinkable and has an ever-so subtle hint of the sea, thanks to our bivalve buddies. Not Suitable For Vegetarians! 5% alcohol; \$6.5 pints

- **Slaapmutske Triple Nightcap**

A hazy, golden-colored tripel from Melle, Belgium. Super Rare to find on tap! 8.5% Alcohol. \$5.5 goblets

- **Terrapin Hopsecutioner IPA**

Brewed in Athens, Georgia by Terrapin Brewery, Hopsecutioner is as ridiculously hoppy as the name implies. Not for light beer drinkers! 7.3% alcohol. \$6.25 pints
